

ACCOMPANYING INFORMATION FOR THE MUSIC DEPARTMENT AT SUU

At Southern Utah University Music Department, accompanists are assigned for
Each instrument studio has an assigned accompanist, and it is the student's responsibility to get the music sent to the accompanist as soon as possible. Music must be submitted to the accompanist at least four weeks before a performance. The accompanist has the right to decline music that is overly demanding.

Below is an <https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html> that gives information on the minimum allotted time each student gets with their accompanist. This includes lesson and rehearsal times as well as Friday Recitals, Studio Recitals, and Juries. These <https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html> can be paid any time online at <https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html> during the semester but will be due in the 2 weeks before juries. Students will not be allowed to perform their jury if the accompanist fee is not paid.

Each student is required to perform once in the semester on a <https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html>. The studio teacher, student, and accompanist will confer on whether the performance will be on a Friday Recital, or a Studio Recital at the end of the semester.

<https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html> spots will be on a first come first serve basis, and a [Friday Recital Request](https://www.suu.edu/pva/music/handbook.html) must be submitted prior to Tuesday by midnight on the week you would like to perform. Requests may be submitted any time prior to the week of the performance. Requests do not guarantee a spot on the recital but must be approved to secure a spot. Students preparing for a solo recital are welcome to perform on a Friday Recital. Once the student submits the request online, the information will go to the teacher, accompanist, and music office for approval.
