<p>Definition: A run-on sentence occurs when two independent clauses (sentences with subjects and verbs) are joined either without any punctuation or conjunction between them (also known as fused sentences) or with a conjunction with missing punctuation.</p>	<p>Examples: Those are nice boots I like your belt too. [Two independent clauses without any punctuation or conjunction] Those are nice boots O</p>
